We would like to share with you the highlights of the year that was, as a way to thank all of you and to celebrate key initiatives and milestones that we reached in 2019.



HIV TELEHEALTH TRAINING PROGRAM

(HTTP)

HTTP bridges the gap in HIV response through Information and Communications Technologies (ICTs) while strenthening collaboration among HIV care providers from private institutions and local government-led facilities.

This is SHIP's groundbreaking and highly-successful online distance learning program on Primary HIV Care, on its 2nd year, and 3rd batch.



This 16-week ICT-enabled distance education program connects HIV experts to health personnel & non-specialists from various facilities all over the Philippines through an innovative and cost-effective approach.





HTTP employs a teleconferencing and webinar application that has augmented the knowledge of skills of health workers from all over the country. This project is supported by Gilead Sciences.

With HTTP, SHIP aims to:

- increase the knowledge base and skillsets of HIV healthcare providers in HIV primary care, management of opportunistic infections and co-occurring diseases and other issues surrounding HIV care.
- improve the communication and referral system among hubs and paramedical services
- roll out this program on a national level with partners and supporters

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HIV PRIMARY CARE WORKSHOPS

SHIP'S popular and innovative 2 1/2 day training course on HIV Primary Care is the first of its kind, and does away with the traditional lecture format of the past, and involves interactive learning experiences with collaborative tasks and casebased learning.

The sessions are led by the best of specialists and experts in field of HIV, public health, gender & sexuality, law & human rights.

This year, we conducted two workshops, with a total of



coming from public and private hospitals, treatment hubs, city health offices and social hygiene clinics, BPOs and CBOs. At the end of the course, participants are awarded certificates and CPD units.

This year's run of our HIV Primary care Workshops are supported by VXI, Camber Pharmaceuticals and Medicomm Pacific.

This year, SHIP has inked an agreement with VXI Global Solutions, LLC, one of the largest BPOs globally and in the Philippines, to be a strategic partner in strengthening the company's HIV in the Workforce Policy.

We are working closely with VXI's HR and Medical groups to provide HIV 101 lectures, prevention and testing services to their 12,000 employees in Metro Manila, Clark and Dayao.

SHIP is providing technical assistance to VXI in the following areas:

- Upgdating and strengthening the company's HIV in the Workforce Policy
- Training of medical teams on HIV primary care
- Developing IEC materials on basic HIV information for employees
- Providing video clips on basic HIV information
- Organizing World AIDS Day events
- Planning for AIDS Candelight events for 2020
- Extending SHIP Clinic as a referral facility for HIV cases

Connect for Life (CFL) is a collaboration between Janssen Pharmaceutical Companies of Johnson & Johnson (Janssen) and SHIP, encouraging people to adhere to their HIV medication and empowering them to choose healthy behaviors.

Connect for Life™ uses basic mobile phones to send short, simple & actionable messages to influence behavior through health tips and adherence reminders. It offers treating physicians a clinical information system to further engage with their patients and offers patients the means to stay connected across remote locations. It helps reduce situations where patients could experience stigma and removes the challenges of remote access by allowing health providers to follow up on patients any time, anywhere.

SHIP's Supportive Case Management Program provides assistance in obtaining medical, social, community, legal, financial and other needed services for people living with HIV and AIDS.





Our program has focused on basic counseling, psychoeducation and strengthening referral systems. The sessions are focused on assisting patients in 3 essential areas:

Physical wellness Mental Health Financial stability

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We have completed the first phase of this project, which aspires to curb the continuous increase of HIV epidemic through empowerment of community organizations that are in the frontlines of providing programs on prevention, treatment, care and support for key populations affected by HIV.

The main objective of this program is to enhance the capacity of CBOs in the area of organizational management. We strongly believe that an organization with strong skill sets on technical, research, and grant proposal writing will greatly impact the sustainability of their projects and services in their respective localities.

With the completed baseline assessment, we will be organizing a series of Bootcamps and online training programs in 2020, to strengthen and sustain these organizations. This initiative is supported by Gilead Sciences.
