## NEWLY DIAGNOSED

In June 2021, there were 1,496<sup>a</sup> confirmed HIV-positive individuals reported to the HIV/AIDS & ART Registry of the Philippines (HARP). This was two times higher compared to the same time period last year (490) [Figure 1]. The increase in the number of diagnosed HIV cases this month was due to the inclusion of delayed reports<sup>a</sup> from previous months. Sixteen percent (232) had clinical manifestations of advanced HIV infection<sup>b</sup> at the time of testing [Table 1].

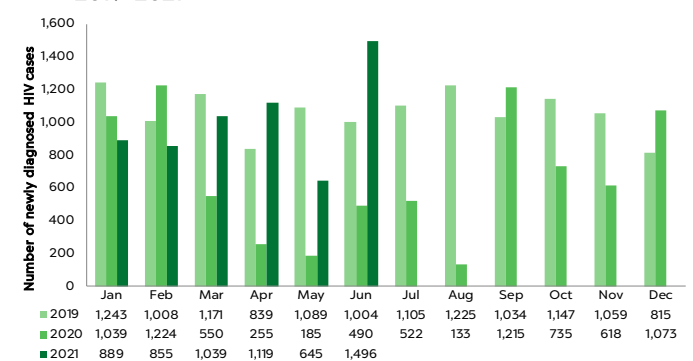


Fig. 2: Proportion by region of residence among newly diagnosed cases, Jun 2021 (N=1,496)

Thirty-five percent (525) were from National Capital Region (NCR). Regions 4A, 3, 7, and 6 comprised the top five regions with the most number of newly reported cases for this reporting period, together accounting for 77% of the total cases [Figure 2].

Sexual contact remained as the predominant mode of transmission (95%, 1,425). Among the newly reported cases who acquired HIV through sexual contact, 64% (909) were through male to male sex, 26% (366) through males who have sex with both males and females<sup>f</sup>, and 10% (150) through male to female sex. Further, 11 (1%) were infected through sharing of infected needles, three (<1%) children acquired HIV through mother-to-child transmission, and 57 cases (4%) had no data on mode of transmission.

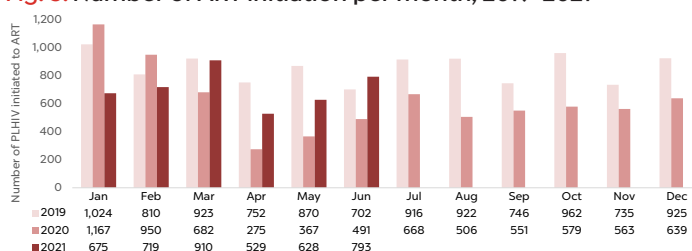
Moreover, there were five HIV positive women reported pregnant at the time of diagnosis. Four cases were from NCR and one case was from Region 6.

## Anti-retroviral Therapy

In June 2021, there were 793 people with HIV who were initiated on ART and were on first line regimen [Figure 3]. The median CD4 of these patients upon enrollment was at 183.5 cells/mm<sup>3</sup>. Ninety-five percent were on the first line regimen, 4% were on second the line, and 1% were on the third line of regimen.

A total of 51,129 people living with HIV (PLHIV) were presently on ART as of June 2021. Ninety-six percent (49,170) were males. The age of reported cases ranged from 1 to 80 years (median: 32 years old). Ninety-five percent were on the first line regimen, 4% were on second the line, and 1% were on the third line of regimen.

Fig. 1: Number of newly diagnosed cases per month, 2019-2021

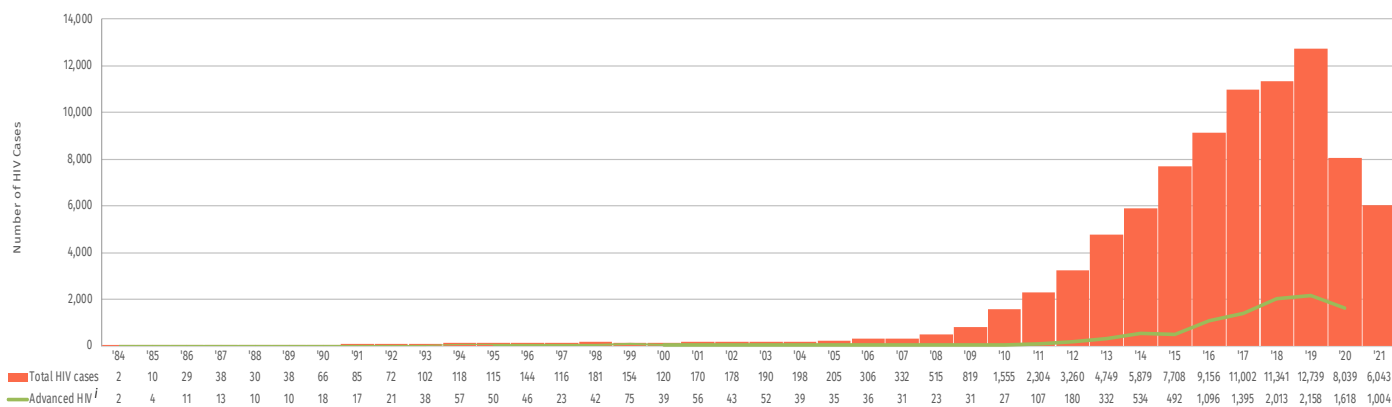

## EPIDEMIC TRENDS OF HIV/AIDS IN THE PHILIPPINES, JAN 1984 - JUN 2021

The first case of HIV infection in the Philippines was reported in 1984. Since then, there have been 88,108 confirmed HIV cases reported to the HARP. Ninety-four percent (82,839) of those diagnosed were male<sup>g</sup> and 6% (5,258) were female<sup>g</sup>. At the time of diagnosis, more than half (51%, 44,733) were 25–34 years old<sup>h</sup> while 25,331 (29%) were youth (15–24 years old<sup>h</sup>). The median age was 28 years old (age range: 1 month - 82 years). Thirteen percent (11,778) of the reported cases had clinical manifestations of advanced infection<sup>i</sup> at the time of testing. Moreover, 66% (58,320) of the total diagnosed cases in the Philippines were reported from January 2016 to June 2021.

**Fig. 4:** Number of HIV cases and advanced infections reported in the Philippines by year, Jan 1984 to Jun 2021 (N=88,108)



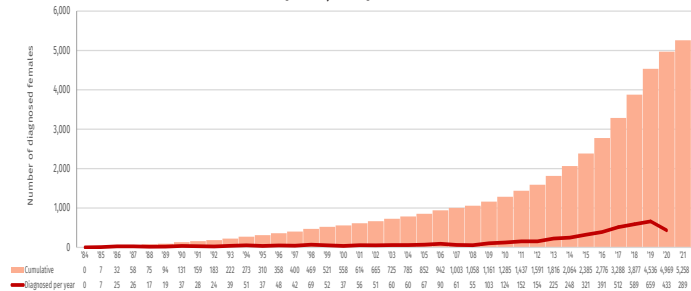
### Sex and Age

In the early years of the epidemic (1984–1990), 62% (131 of 213 cases) of those diagnosed were female. However, since 1991 the proportion of diagnosed males has been greater than that of females each year. In the past 10 years (2011–2021), proportion of yearly diagnosed cases among males were more than 93%.

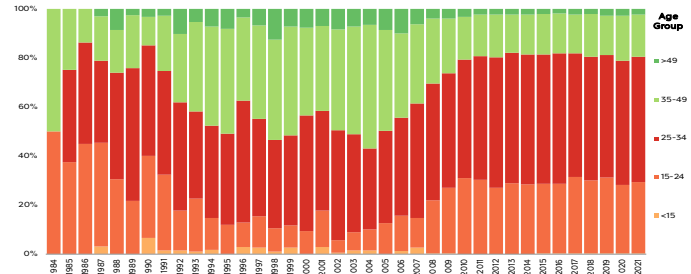
The number of diagnosed HIV infections among females has also been increasing since January 1984 [Figure 5]. From January to June 2021, 289 females were diagnosed with HIV, which was more than three times higher compared with cases reported in 2016 (82). Ninety-two percent (4,853) of all female cases since 1984 were in the reproductive age group (15–49 years old) at the time of testing.

The predominant age group among those diagnosed has shifted to 25–34 years old starting 2006 from 35–49 years old in 2001 to 2005 [Figure 6]. In addition, the proportion of HIV positive cases in the 15–24 year age group increased in the past 10 years, from 22% in 2001 to 2010 to 29% in 2011 to 2020.

### Geographic Distribution

From January 1984 to June 2021, the regions with the most number of reported cases were NCR with 32,547 (37%) cases followed by Region 4A with 13,705 (16%) cases, Region 3 with 8,821 (10%) cases, Region 7 with 7,488 (8%) cases, and Region 6 with 4,934 (6%) cases. Twenty-two percent (19,513) of the cases came from the rest of the country while 1,100 (1%) did not report region of residence [Table 2].

Of the 5,258 females reported with HIV, 1,362 (26%) were from NCR, 802 (15%) were from Region 3, 660 (13%) were from Region 4A, and 645 (12%) were from Region 7. Furthermore, 1,497 (28%) were from other regions; while 292 (6%) had no reported data on region of residence.

The regions with the most number of Overseas Filipino Workers (OFW) reported to HARP were from NCR with 2,469 (31%) cases, Region 4A with 1,400 (18%) cases, and Region 3 with 1,016 (13%) cases. Further, 2,817 (35%) cases were from other regions and 269 (3%) had no data on region of residence.

## Modes of Transmission (MOT)

From January 1984 to June 2021, sexual contact among males who have sex with males [MSM] (81%, 71,152) was the predominant MOT, followed by male-female sex (15%, 13,286), and sharing of infected needles (3%, 2,354). More than half of MSM (52%, 37,194) were 25–34 years old at the time of testing, and 31% (21,945) were 15–24 years old. Among diagnosed females, male-female sex was the most common MOT (93%, 4,886) followed by sharing of infected needles (3%, 139) [Table 3].

A total of 224 children (less than 10 years old<sup>n</sup>), eight adolescents (10–19 years old<sup>n</sup>), and one adult foreigner (22 years old<sup>n</sup>) were reported to have acquired HIV through mother-to-child transmission.

From 1984 to 2006, the most common MOT (62%, 1,661) was male-female sex. From 2007, the trend shifted to sexual contact among MSM as the predominant MOT and has remained as such to the present. From January 2016 to June 2021, 84% (49,147) out of the total (58,320) diagnosed cases were MSM.

From 1984 to 2009, transmission through sharing of infected needles was less than one percent of the total cases reported. In 2010, 9% (147) of the total cases (1,555) reported were among people who inject drugs (PWID). However, the proportion of new cases among PWID remained at less than 6% of the total cases in the succeeding years.

Regional patterns vary across different MOT. Thirty-nine percent (28,038) of ever diagnosed males who have sex with males were from NCR; almost all (99%, 2,347) reported cases among people who inject drugs were from Region 7; and the highest proportion of females who engaged in transactional sex (31%) were from Region 3.

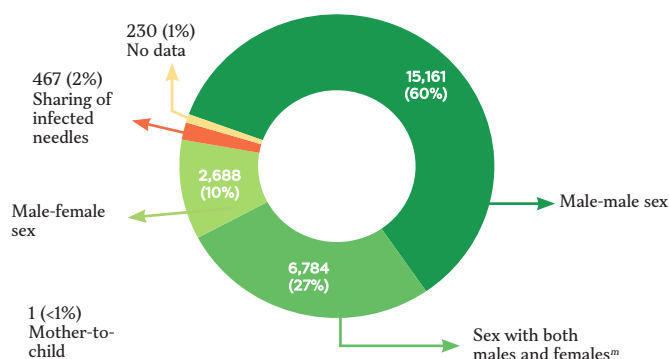
## SPECIFIC POPULATION

### Youth (15–24 years old)

In June 2021, 426 (28%) cases were among youth 15–24 years old and 96% were male. Almost all (99%, 420) were infected through sexual contact (35 male-female sex, 286 male-male sex, 99 sex with both males & females<sup>m</sup>). Six (1%) cases had no data on the MOT.

From January 1984 to June 2021, 25,331 (29%) of the reported cases were 15–24 years old. Ninety-seven percent (24,633) were infected through sexual contact (2,688 male-female sex, 15,161 male-male sex, 6,784 sex with both males & females<sup>m</sup>), 467 (2%) were infected through sharing of needles, one (<1%) was infected through mother-to-child transmission, and 230 (1%) had no data on the MOT. Sixty-eight percent (17,338 out of 25,331) of youth (at the time of testing) were diagnosed from January 2016 to June 2021. Since 2004, more males were diagnosed from this age group. However, the number of diagnosed HIV cases among female youth had increased significantly in the past five years. The total diagnosed females aged 15–24 years old in January to June 2021 (77) was almost six times higher compared with the same reporting period (13) in 2011 [Figure 7].

**Fig. 7: MOT among youth, Jan 1984 - Jun 2021 (n=25,331)**



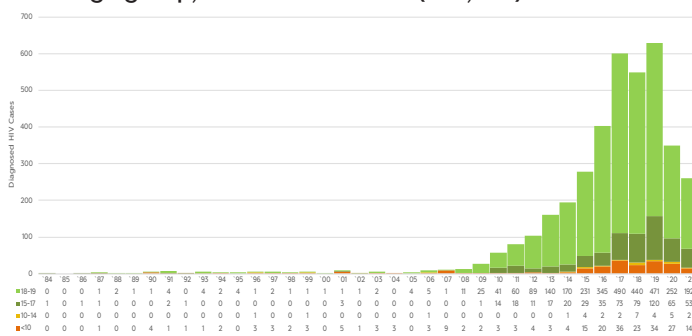
### Children (<10) & Adolescents (10–19)

In June 2021, there were 57 newly reported adolescents. Of these, 18% (10) were 15–17 years old, and 82% (47) were 18–19 years old. Almost all (98%) adolescents were infected through sexual contact (7 male-female sex, 38 male-male sex, 11 sex with both males & females<sup>m</sup>) and one adolescent had no data on MOT. Further, three children were infected through mother-to-child transmission and one child had no data on MOT.

Four percent (3,805) of all diagnosed cases from January 1984 to June 2021 were 19 years old and younger at the time of diagnosis. Among the total, 235 (6%) were less than 10 years old at the time of testing, 30 (1%) were 10–14 years old, 544 (14%) were 15–17 years old, and 2,996 (79%) were 18–19 years old. [Figure 8]

There was a significant increase of cases reported among age groups 15–17 and 18–19 in 2019, following the ratification of the Philippine HIV and AIDS Policy Act (RA 11166). Diagnosed cases in 2019 (120) among 15–17 years old were six times higher compared to 2014 (20) while 18–19 years old were three times higher in comparison of the same reporting period of 2019 (471) and 2014 (192).

## Transgender Women (TGW)<sup>o</sup>

Reporting of gender identity was included in the HARP starting year 2018. TGW were males (sex assigned at birth) who reported their gender identity as female at the time of testing.

In June 2021, there were 19 TGW diagnosed with HIV. Of these, 42% (8) were 25–34 years old, 36% (7) 15–24 years old, and 21% (4) were 35–49 years old. The age of diagnosis ranged from 21 to 38 (median: 25).

A total of 988 TGW were diagnosed from January 2018 to June 2021. Almost all (99%, 978) of the cases acquired HIV through sexual contact and less than 1% (3) through sharing of infected needles. Seven (1%) TGW had no data on MOT.

Further, half (50%, 490) of the TGW were 25–34 years old at the time of testing, 29% (283) were 15–24 years old, 19% (191) were 35–49 years old, and 2% (24) were 50 years and older. The median age of diagnosis was 28 years old (age range: 15 to 63 years old) [Figure 9].

## Transactional Sex

People who engage in transactional sex are those who reported that they either pay for sex, regularly accept payment for sex, or do both. Reporting of transactional sex was included in the HARP starting December 2012.

In June 2021, 10% (153) of the newly diagnosed engaged in transactional sex [Table 4]. Ninety-nine percent (151) were male. Their age range from 17 to 61 years old (median: 29 years old). More than half (57% or 86) of the males reported paying for sex only, 30% (46) reported accepting payment for sex only and 13% (19) engaged in both. One female belong in the 15–24 age group and another in 35–49 years old. One case was reported to have accepted payment for sex only and another engaged in both.

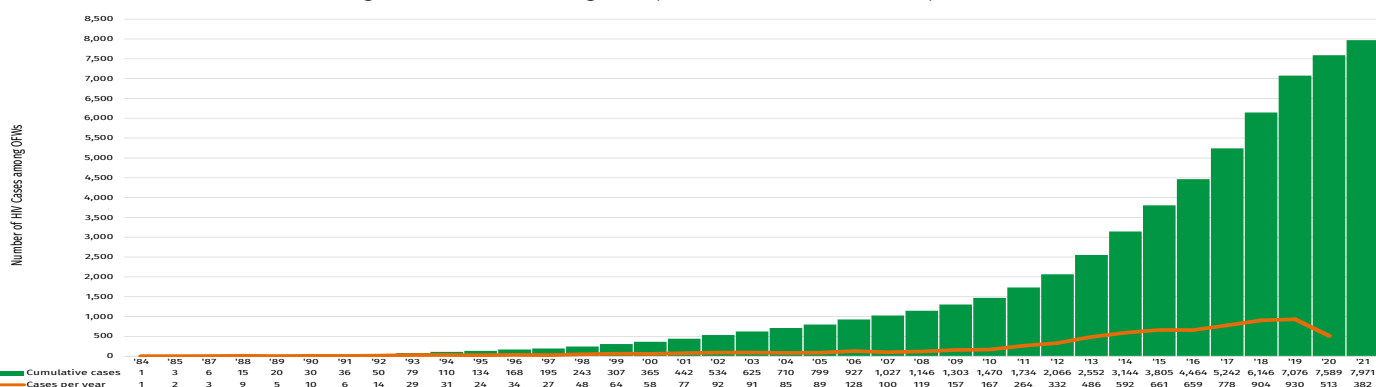
A total of 9,323 cases reported to HARP from December 2012 to June 2021 were people who engaged in transactional sex. Ninety-seven percent (9,013) were male. There were 5,021 (54%) who paid for sex, 2,924 (31%) who accepted payment for sex, and 1,378 (15%) who engaged in both [Table 4].

## Overseas Filipino Workers (OFW)

Eighty-three Filipinos who worked overseas within the past five years, whether on land or at sea, were newly reported in June 2021. They comprised 6% of the total cases for this period. Of these 93% (77) were male. Further, 96% (74) of the male cases were infected through sexual contact (6 male-female sex, 42 male-male sex, and 26 sex with both males and females<sup>p</sup>). The ages of male OFWs ranged from 19 to 57 years (median: 33 years). Almost half (48%, 37) of the male cases were 25–34 years old at the time of testing, 31% (24) were 35–49 years old, 13% (10) were 15–24 years old, and 8% (6) were 50 years & older. All of the female OFWs were infected through sexual contact. Four of the female cases were 35–49 years old and one each in 25–34 and 50 & older age group. The age range among diagnosed female OFWs were from 22 to 43 years old (median: 39 years old).

From January 1984 to June 2021, 9% (7,971) of the total cases were OFWs [Figure 10]. Of these, 6,951 (87%) were male. Almost all (98%, 6,843) of male cases were infected through sexual contact (1,659 male-female sex, 3,113 male-male sex and 2,071 sex with both males and females<sup>p</sup>). The ages of male OFWs ranged from 16 to 80 years (median: 32 years). Among 1,020 female OFWs, 97% (993) were infected through sexual contact. The ages of female OFWs ranged from 20 to 73 years old (median: 35 years old).

Fig. 9: Number of reported TGW diagnosed with HIV by age group, Jan 2018 - Jun 2021 (n=988)

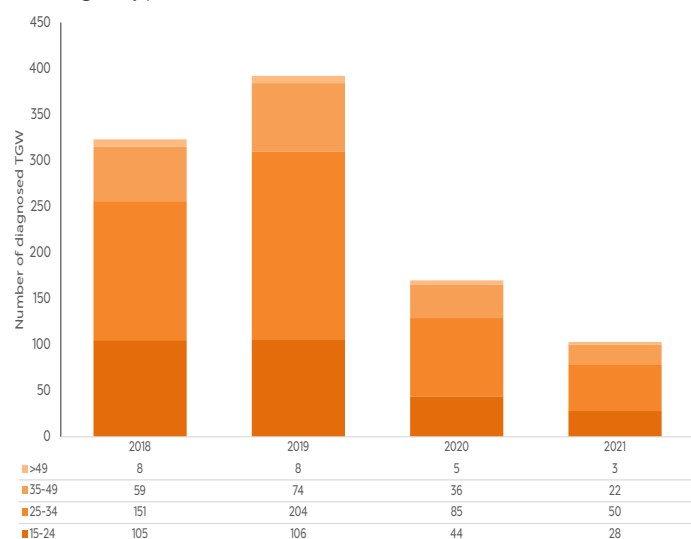

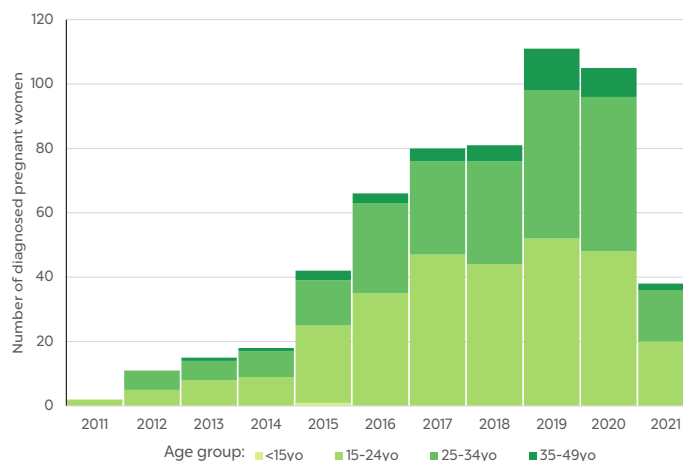
## Pregnant Women with HIV

Reporting of pregnancy status at the time of diagnosis was included in the HARP starting year 2011.

From January to June 2021, there were 38 HIV positive women reported pregnant at the time of diagnosis. Of these, 40% (15) were from NCR, 18% (7) each were from Region 3 and Region 4A, 8% (3) were from Region 7, 16% (6) were from the rest of the country. The age of diagnosis ranged from 15 to 39 years old (median age: 24).

Since 2011, a total of 569 diagnosed women were reported pregnant at the time of diagnosis. More than half (52%, 294) were 15-24 years old and 41% (233) were 25-34 years old [Figure 11]. The regions with highest number of diagnosed pregnant cases with HIV were NCR (44%, 250), Region 7 (18%, 100), Region 4A (12%, 70), Region 3 (10%, 55), and Region 11 (4%, 22).

## Mortality

In June 2021, there were 52<sup>a</sup> reported deaths due to any cause among people with HIV. Ninety-six percent (50) were males. Five (10%) cases were 15-24 years old, 25 (48%) were 25-34 years old, 20 (38%) were 35-49 years old and 2 (4%) were 50 years and older [Figure 12]. Thirteen percent (13) were from Region 3. Region 6, Region 4A, National Capital Region (NCR), Region 11, and 12 comprised the top regions with the most number of deaths.

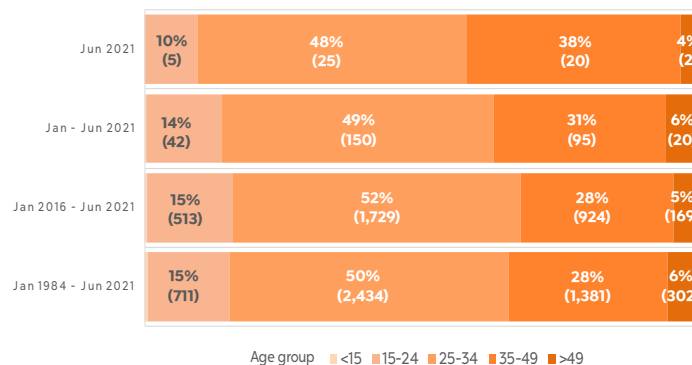
A total of 4,860 deaths were reported from January 1984 to June 2021, and 92% (4,489) of whom were male. Thirty (1%) were less than 15 years old<sup>b</sup> at the time of death, 711 (15%) were 15-24 years old<sup>c</sup>, 2,434 (50%) were 25-34 years old<sup>d</sup>, 1,381 (28%) were 35-49 years old<sup>e</sup>, and 302 (6%) were 50 years and older<sup>f</sup> [Figure 12].

From 1984 to June 2021, the top 5 regions with the most number of reported deaths were NCR, Region 4A, Region 3, Region 6, and Region 7. Further, 121 (2%) cases had no data on region of residence [Table 5].

### HIV/AIDS & ART REGISTRY OF THE PHILIPPINES

The HARP is the official record of total number of diagnoses (laboratory-confirmed), ART outcome status and deaths among people with HIV in the Philippines. All individuals in the registry are confirmed by the San Lazaro Hospital STD/AIDS Cooperative Central Laboratory (SACL) which is the HIV/AIDS National Reference Laboratory (NRL) and DOH Certified Rapid HIV Diagnostic Algorithm - HIV-1/2 Confirmatory Laboratories (CrCLs). Confirmed HIV positive individuals were reported to the DOH-Epidemiology Bureau (EB) and recorded to HARP. ART figures are counts of HIV positive adult and pediatric patients currently enrolled and accessing Antiretroviral (ARV) medication during the reporting period in 170 treatment hubs and primary HIV care treatment facilities that had reported in the HARP. This report did not include patients who have previously taken ARV but have died, left the country, have been lost to follow-up and/or opted not to take ARV. Lost to follow-up is considered once a person have failed to visit a treatment facility more than 3 months after the expected date of ARV refill.

HARP is a passive surveillance system. Except for HIV confirmation by the NRL & CrCLs, all other data submitted to the HARP are secondary and cannot be verified. Hence, HARP cannot determine if an individual's reported place of residence is where the person got infected, or where the person lived after being infected, or where the person is presently living. This limitation has major implications on data interpretation. Readers are advised to interpret the data with caution and consider other sources of information before arriving at conclusions.
