## NEWLY DIAGNOSED CASES

In March 2022, there were 1,539 confirmed HIV-positive individuals reported to the HIV/AIDS & ART Registry of the Philippines (HARP). This was a 48% increase compared to the same reporting period last year (1,038) [Figure 1]. Twenty-nine percent (449) had clinical manifestations of advanced HIV infection<sup>b</sup> at the time of testing [Table 1].

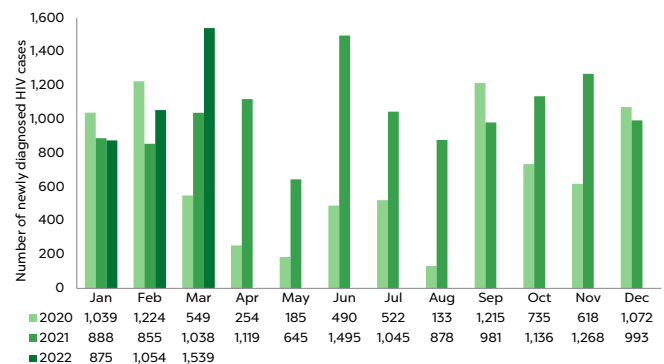
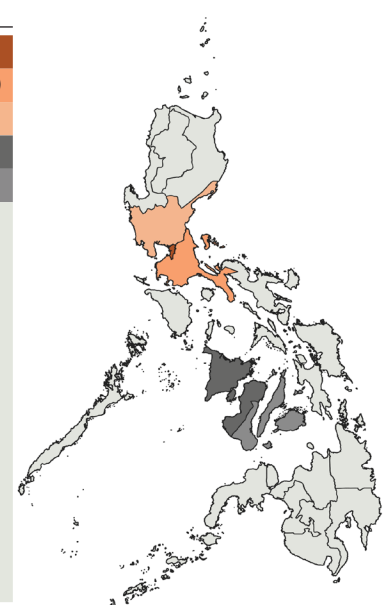


Figure 2: Distribution of newly diagnosed cases by region of residence, Mar 2022 (N=1,539)

Twenty-seven percent (410) were from the National Capital Region (NCR). Other regions that comprised the top five of newly reported cases for this reporting period were Regions 4A, 3, 6, and 7; together accounting for 70% of the total cases [Figure 2].

Sexual contact remained the predominant mode of transmission (98%, 1,502). Among the newly reported cases who acquired HIV through sexual contact, 65% (981) were through male to male sex, 24% (356) through males who have sex with both males and females<sup>c</sup>, and 11% (165) through male to female sex. Further, of the newly reported cases, 1% (11) were transmitted through sharing of infected needles, less than 1% (3) were children who acquired HIV through mother-to-child transmission, and 1% (23) of the cases had no data on mode of transmission.

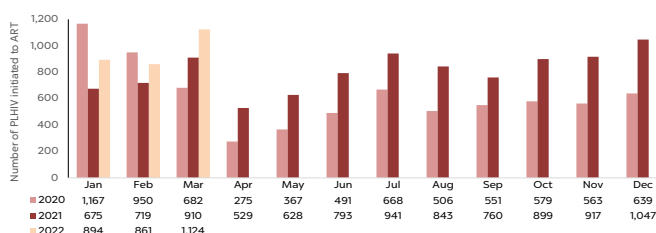
Moreover, there were eleven HIV positive women reported pregnant at the time of diagnosis. Three cases each were from Region 4A and NCR, two cases were from Region 1, and one each from Region 4B, Region 6, and Region 8. The age of reported cases ranged from 16 to 38 years old (median: 22).

## Anti-retroviral Therapy

In March 2022, there were 1,124 people with HIV who were initiated on ART. This was a 25% increase compared to the same reporting period last year (910) [Figure 3]. Ninety-nine percent (1,121) were on the first line regimen, one was on the second line regimen and two were on third-line regimen. The median CD4 of these patients upon enrollment was at 209 cells/mm<sup>3</sup>.

A total of 58,746 people living with HIV (PLHIV) were presently on ART as of March 2022. Ninety-six percent (56,563) were males. The age of reported cases ranged from 1 to 80 years old (median: 32). Ninety-six percent were on the first line regimen, 3% were on the second line, and <1% were on the third line of regimen.

Figure 1: Number of newly diagnosed cases per month, 2020-2022

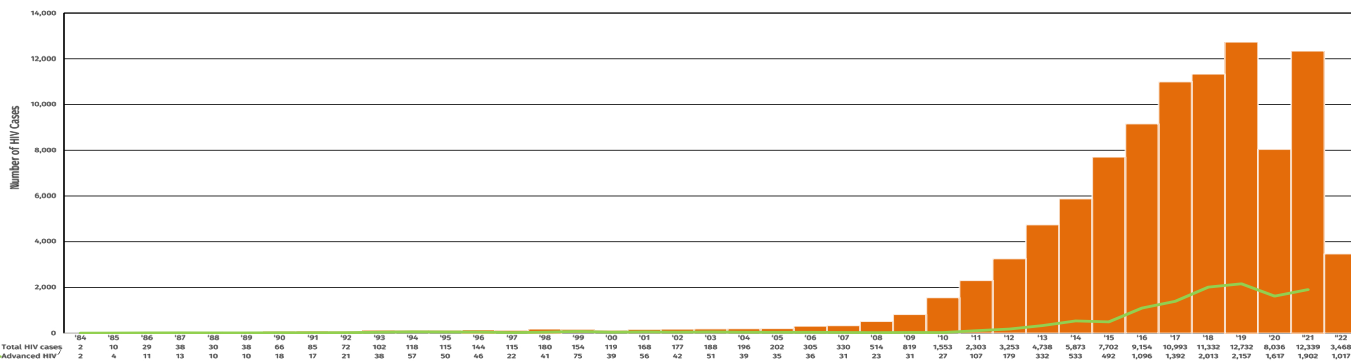

## EPIDEMIC TRENDS OF HIV/AIDS IN THE PHILIPPINES, JAN 1984-MAR 2022

Since the first reported HIV infection in the Philippines in 1984, there have been 97,792 confirmed HIV cases reported to the HARP [Figure 4]. Ninety-four percent (92,130) of those diagnosed were male<sup>b</sup> and 6% (5,651) were female<sup>b</sup>. At the time of diagnosis, more than half (51%, 49,579) were 25-34 years old<sup>i</sup> while 29% (28,294) were among youth (15-24 years old<sup>i</sup>). The median age was 28 years old (age range: 1 month - 82 years). Fourteen percent (13,682) of the reported cases had clinical manifestations of advanced infection<sup>j</sup> at the time of testing [Figure 4]. Moreover, there was a 25% increase of diagnosed cases in January to March 2022 (3,468) compared to the reported case last year of the same quarter, January to March 2021 (2,781) [Figure 4].

**Figure 4:** Number of HIV cases and advanced infections reported in the Philippines by year, Jan 1984-Mar 2022 (N=97,792)



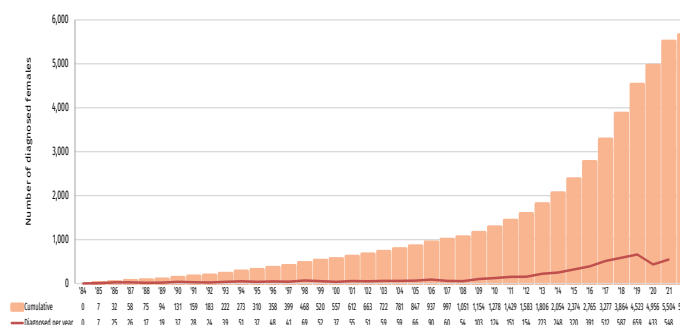
### Sex and Age

In the early years of the epidemic (1984-1990), 62% (131 of 213 cases) of those diagnosed were female. However, since the start of 1991, the proportion of diagnosed males has been greater than that of females each year. In the past 10 years (2012-2022), proportion of yearly diagnosed cases among males were more than 95% compared to females.

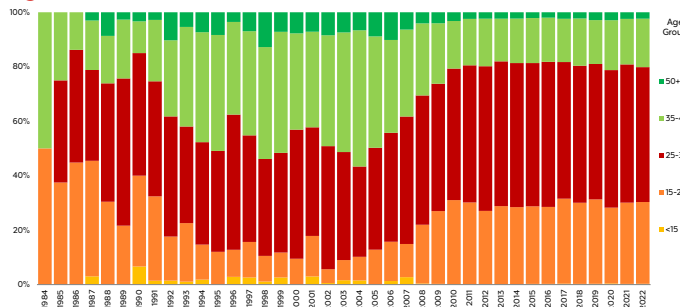
On the other hand, the number of female cases diagnosed with HIV has also been constantly increasing since January 1984 [Figure 5]. Ninety-three percent (5,227) of all female cases since 1984 were in the reproductive age group (15-49 years old) at the time of testing, while there were 26 females with no data on age.

The predominant age group among those diagnosed has shifted from 35-49 years old in 2001 to 2005 to mostly among 25-34 years old starting 2006 [Figure 6]. In addition, the proportion of HIV positive cases in the 15-24 year age group increased in the past 10 years, from 22% in 2002 to 2011 to 29% in 2012 to 2022.

### Geographic Distribution

From January 1984 to March 2022, the regions with the most number of reported cases were NCR, followed by Region 4A, Region 3, Region 7, and Region 6. Twenty-three percent (22,045) of the cases came from the rest of the country while one percent (1,092) did not report region of residence [Table 2].

Of the 5,651 females reported with HIV, 26% (1,463) were from NCR, 15% (842) were from Region 3, 13% (729) were from Region 4A, and 12% (689) were from Region 7. Furthermore, 29% (1,639) were from other regions, while 5% (289) had no reported data on region of residence.

The regions with the most number of Overseas Filipino Workers (OFW) reported to HARP were from NCR with 31% (2,607) cases, Region 4A with 18% (1,527) cases, and Region 3 with 13% (1,074) cases. Further, 36% (3,021) cases were from other regions and 3% (265) had no data on region of residence.

## Modes of Transmission (MOT)

From January 1984 to March 2022, sexual contact among males who have sex with males [MSM] (87%, 79,700) was the predominant MOT, followed by male-female sex (10%, 8,944), and sharing of infected needles (2%, 2,277). More than half of MSM (52% , 41,546) were 25-34 years old at the time of testing, and (31%, 24,649) were 15-24 years old. Among diagnosed females, male-female sex was the most common MOT (93%, 5,262) followed by sharing of infected needles (3%, 144) [Table 3].

A total of 243 children (less than 10 years old<sup>1</sup>), nine adolescents (10-19 years old<sup>1</sup>), and one adult foreigner (22 years old<sup>1</sup>) were reported to have acquired HIV through mother-to-child transmission.

From 1984 to 2006, the most common MOT (62%, 1,651) was male-female sex. From 2007, the trend shifted to sexual contact among MSM as the predominant MOT and has remained as such to the present. From January 2017 to March 2022, 63% (50,107) out of the total (79,700) diagnosed cases were MSM.

From 1984 to 2009, transmission through sharing of infected needles was less than one percent of the total cases reported. In 2010, 9% (147) of the total cases (1,553) reported were among people who inject drugs (PWID). However, the proportion of new reported cases among PWID decreased to 1% of the total cases in the past five years.

Regional patterns vary across different MOT. Thirty-nine percent (30,534) of diagnosed males who have sex with males were from NCR; and almost all (99%, 2,414) reported cases among people who inject drugs were from Region 7.

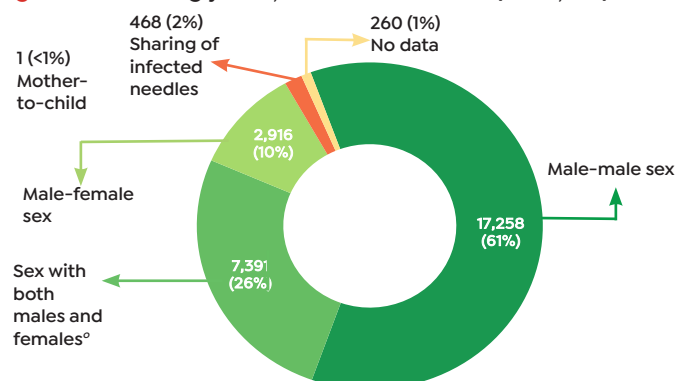
## SPECIFIC POPULATION

### Youth (15-24 years old)

In March 2022, 447 (29%) cases were youth 15-24 years old , among which 94% were male. Ninety-nine percent (441) cases were infected through sexual contact (37 male-female sex, 322 male-male sex, 82 sex with both males & females<sup>c</sup>), while five cases had no data on MOT.

From January 1984 to March 2022, 28,294 (29%) of the reported cases were 15-24 years old. Ninety-seven percent (27,565) were infected through sexual contact (2,916 male-female sex, 17,258 male-male sex, 7,391 sex with both males & females<sup>c</sup>), 468 (2%) were infected through sharing of needles, one (<1%) was infected through mother-to-child transmission, and 260 (1%) had no data on MOT [Figure 7]. At the time of testing, 63% (17,715 out of 28,294) of the diagnosed youth were reported from January 2017 to March 2022. Since 2004, more males were diagnosed from this age group. However, the number of diagnosed HIV cases among female youth had increased significantly in the past five years. The total diagnosed females aged 15-24 years old in January to March 2022 (53) was almost eight times higher compared with the same reporting period (6) in 2012.

**Fig. 7: MOT among youth, Jan 1984-Mar 2022 (n=28,294)**



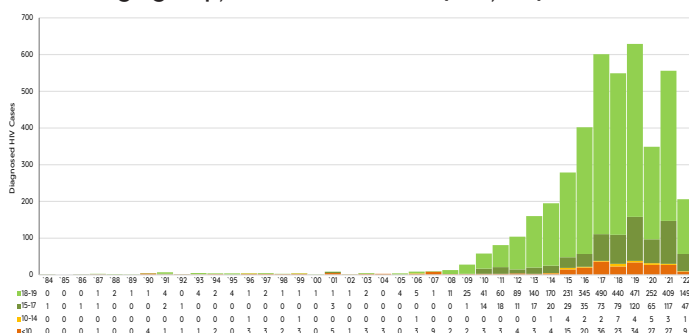
### Children (<10) & Adolescents (10-19)

In March 2022, there were 77 newly reported cases among adolescents. Of these, 27% (21) were 15-17 years old, and 73% (56) were 18-19 years old. All adolescents were infected through unprotected sexual contact (10 male-female sex, 54 male-male sex, 13 sex with both males & females<sup>c</sup>). Further, there were 5 newly diagnosed children. Three were acquired through mother-to-child transmission, and two other have no data on mode of transmission.

Four percent (4,306) of all diagnosed cases from January 1984 to March 2022 were 19 years old or younger at the time of diagnosis. Among the total, 257 (6%) were less than 10 years old at the time of testing, 32 (1%) were 10-14 years old, 655 (15%) were 15-17 years old, and 3,362 (78%) were 18-19 years old [Figure 8].

There was an increase of cases reported among age groups 15-17 and 18-19 years in 2019, following the ratification of the Philippine HIV and AIDS Policy Act (RA 11166). Diagnosed cases in 2019 (120) among 15-17 years old were five times higher compared to 2014 (20) while for 18-19 years old, this was almost two times higher in 2019 (471) compared to that 2014 (170) [Figure 8].

## Transgender Women (TGW)

Reporting of gender identity was included in the HARP starting year 2018. Of the total reported cases for March 2022, 59% (904) were cisgender<sup>p</sup>, 3% (45) were transgender women, <1% (2) identified their gender neither as man or a woman, while a single case identified himself as transgender man. Fourteen-percent (210) of the reported cases do not have a data on gender identity. Among the transgender women, 47%(21) were 25-34 years old, 27%(12) 15-24 years old, 22% (10) were 35-49 years old, and 4% (2) were 50 years old and older. The age of diagnosis ranged from 17 to 53 years old (median: 30).

A total of 1,256 TGW were diagnosed from January 2018 to March 2022. Almost all (99%, 1,245) of the cases transmitted through sexual contact while less than 1% (3) through sharing of infected needles. Eight (1%) TGW had no data on MOT.

Further, half (50%, 625) of the TGW were 25-34 years old at the time of testing, 28% (346) were 15-24 years old, 20% (240) were 35-49 years old, and 2% (29) were 50 years and older [Figure 9]. The age of diagnosis ranged from 15 to 63 years old (median: 28).

## Transactional Sex

People who engage in transactional sex are those who reported that they either pay for sex, regularly accept payment for sex, or do both. Reporting of transactional sex was included in the HARP starting December 2012.

In March 2022, 7% (108) of the newly diagnosed engaged in transactional sex within the past 12 months [Table 4]. Ninety-eight percent (106) were male. Their age ranged from 15 to 80 years old (median: 31). More than half (53%, 57) of the males reported paying for sex only, 31% (33) reported accepting payment for sex only, and 17% (18) engaged in both. Two females were diagnosed in this reporting period and have accepted payment for sex.

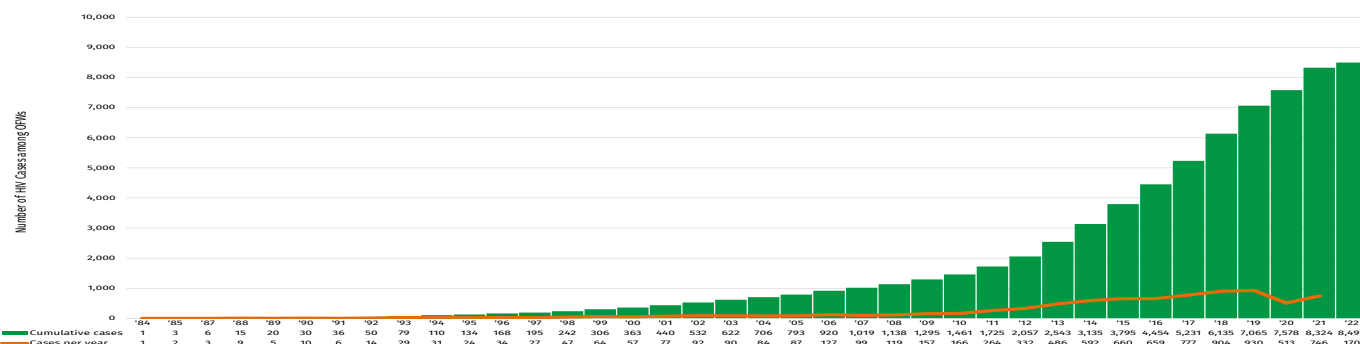
A total of 10,408 cases reported to HARP from December 2012 to March 2022 were people who engaged in transactional sex. Ninety-seven percent (10,079) were male. There were 5,575 (54%) who paid for sex, 3,283 (32%) who accepted payment for sex, and 1,550 (15%) who engaged in both [Table 4].

## Overseas Filipino Workers (OFW)

Seventy Filipinos who worked overseas within the past five years, whether on land or at sea, were newly reported in March 2022. They comprised 5% of the total cases for this period. Of these, 96% (67) were male. Further, 97% (65) of the male cases acquired HIV through sexual contact (8 male-female sex, 38 male-male sex, and 19 sex with both males and females<sup>s</sup>). Two cases were reported to have no data on mode of transmission. The age of male OFWs ranged from 23 to 58 years old (median: 35 years old). Forty-five percent (30) of the male cases were 25-34 years old, 42% (28) were 35-49 years old, 4% (3) cases in 15-24 years old and 9% (6) 50 years & older at the time of testing. All of the female (3) OFWs were infected through sexual contact. The age of the diagnosed female OFW were 30,33, and 34 years old.

From January 1984 to March 2022, 9% (8,494) of the total cases were OFWs [Figure 10]. Of these, 7,447 (88%) were male. Almost all (98%, 7,329) of male cases were infected through sexual contact (1,717 male-female sex, 3,351 male-male sex and 2,261 sex with both males and females<sup>s</sup>). The ages of male OFWs ranged from 16 to 80 years old (median: 32). Among 1,047 female OFWs, 97% (1,020) were infected through sexual contact. The ages of female OFWs ranged from 20 to 73 years old (median: 35).

Figure 9: Number of diagnosed TGW by age group, Jan 2018-Mar 2022 (n=1,256)

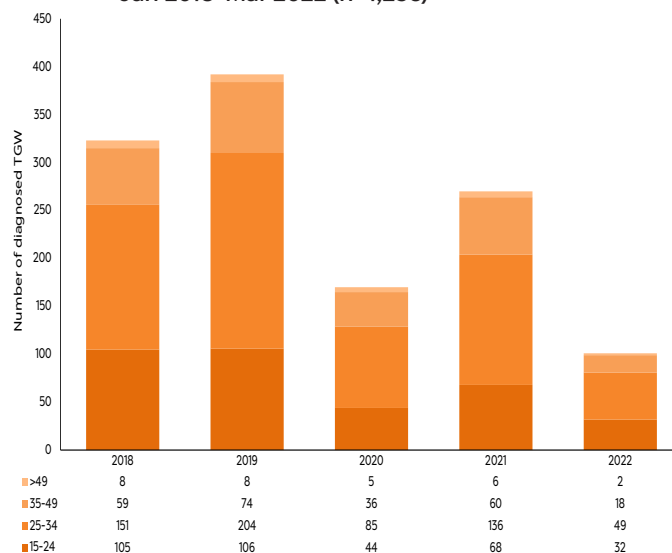

## Pregnant Women with HIV

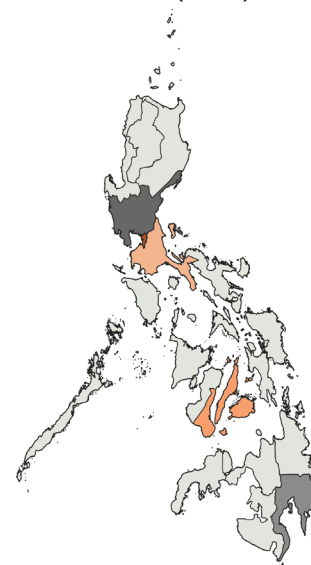
Reporting of pregnancy status at the time of diagnosis was included in HARP since 2011 and there was an observed increase in the number of pregnant women until 2021.

From January to March 2022, there were 29 HIV positive reported pregnant at the time of diagnosis. This was a 16% increase compared to the same reporting period last year (25). Of the reported pregnant women with HIV from January to March 2022, 41% (12) were from NCR, 10% (3) each were reported from Region 4, Region 7 and CARAGA; 7% (2) were from Region 1; and 3% (1) each was from Region 11, Region 3, Region 4B, Region 5, Region 6, and Region 8. The age of diagnosis ranged from 16 to 38 years old (median: 25).

Since 2011, a total of 639 diagnosed women was reported pregnant at the time of diagnosis. The regions with highest number of diagnosed pregnant cases with HIV were NCR (43%, 276), Region 7 (17%, 108), Region 4A (13%, 83), Region 3 (10%, 61), and Region 11 (4%, 23).

## Mortality

In March 2022, there were 66<sup>t</sup> reported deaths due to any cause among people with HIV. Ninety-two percent (61) were males. Ten (15%) cases were 15-24 years old, 34 (52%) were 25-34 years old, 19 (29%) were 35-49 years old and three (4%) were 50 years and older [Figure 12]. There was no reported case for <15 years old. Thirty-three percent (22) were from NCR. Region 3, Region 4A, Region 2, and Region 4B comprised the top regions with the most number of deaths.

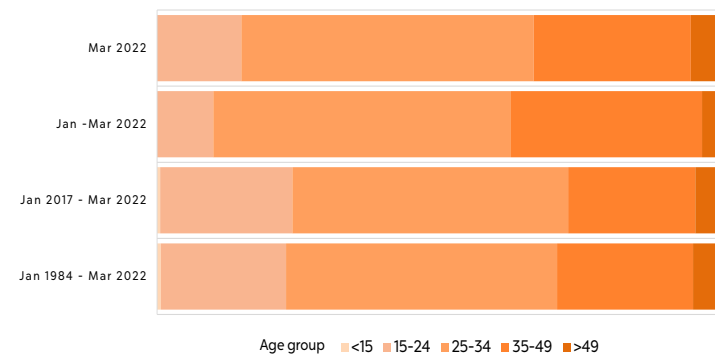
A total of 5,548 deaths were reported from January 1984 to March 2022, and 92% (5,127) of whom were male. Thirty-seven (<1%) were less than 15 years old<sup>u</sup> at the time of death, 1,236 (22%) were 15-24 years old<sup>u</sup>, 2,677 (48%) were 25-34 years old<sup>u</sup>, 1,343 (24%) were 35-49 years old<sup>u</sup>, and 252 (4%) were 50 years and older<sup>u</sup> [Figure 12].

From January 1984 to March 2022, the top 5 regions with the most number of reported deaths were NCR, Region 4A, Region 3, Region 6, and Region 7. Further, 116 (2%) cases had no data on region of residence [Table 5].

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### HIV/AIDS & ART REGISTRY OF THE PHILIPPINES

The HARP is the official record of total number of diagnoses (laboratory-confirmed), ART outcome status and deaths among people with HIV in the Philippines. All individuals in the registry are confirmed by the San Lazaro Hospital STD/AIDS Cooperative Central Laboratory (SACCL) which is the HIV/AIDS National Reference Laboratory (NRL) and DOH Certified Rapid HIV Diagnostic Algorithm - rHIVda Confirmatory Laboratories (CrCLs). Confirmed HIV positive individuals were reported to the DOH Epidemiology Bureau (EB) and recorded to HARP. ART figures are counts of HIV positive adult and pediatric patients currently enrolled and accessing Antiretroviral (ARV) medication during the reporting period in 170 treatment hubs and primary HIV care treatment facilities that had reported in the HARP. This report did not include patients who have previously taken ARV but have died, left the country, have been lost to follow-up and/or opted not to take ARV. Lost to follow-up is considered once a person have failed to visit a treatment facility more than 3 months after the expected date of ARV refill.

HARP is a passive surveillance system. Except for HIV confirmation by the NRL & CrCLs, all other data submitted to the HARP are secondary and cannot be verified. Hence, HARP cannot determine if an individual's reported place of residence is where the person got infected, or where the person lived after being infected, or where the person is presently living. This limitation has major implications on data interpretation. Readers are advised to interpret the data with caution and consider other sources of information before arriving at conclusions.
